## **Gospel Reading**

#### Reading the signs of the times

Jesus said to his disciples: <sup>49</sup>'I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! <sup>50</sup>I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what stress I am under until it is completed! <sup>51</sup>Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division! <sup>52</sup>From now on, five in one household will be divided, three against two and two against three; <sup>53</sup>they will be divided:

father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.'

<sup>54</sup>He also said to the crowds, 'When you see a cloud rising in the west, you immediately say, "It is going to rain"; and so it happens. <sup>55</sup>And when you see the south wind blowing, you say, "There will be scorching heat"; and it happens. <sup>56</sup>You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time?

# **Comments and Questions**

Jesus came to bring peace and harmony. That idea is challenged by Jesus himself (12.49). Any Jew would be profoundly shocked at the examples of discord given (12.53), for the family was the basic unit of their life. Jesus excels in shocking statements (such as, 'if your hand causes you to fall, cut it off!', Matthew 5.30). If we can overcome our shock at the statement we can see that he is emphasising loyalty to himself. He doesn't just have an attractive or interesting message but a profoundly disruptive one, if it is taken seriously. Do we water down Jesus' challenges, to make them more palatable, and take them less seriously?

The section on 'signs of the times' could have been written for today's climate emergency. 'Global warming' seems quite mild, even pleasant for some, but 'global heating' less so. Can we still just talk about it, without doing anything to address it, which would be taking it seriously?
